¹ The word of the LORD which came to Zephaniah the son of Cushi, the son of Gedaliah, the son of Amariah, the son of Hezekiah, in the days of Josiah the son of Amon, king of Judah.

The Great Day of the LORD

² "I will utterly consume everything From the face of the land," Savs the LORD: ³ "I will consume man and beast; I will consume the birds of the heavens, The fish of the sea. And the stumbling blocks along with the wicked. I will cut off man from the face of the land," Savs the LORD. ⁴ "I will stretch out My hand against Judah, And against all the inhabitants of Jerusalem. I will cut off every trace of Baal from this place, The names of the idolatrous priests with the pagan priests-⁵ Those who worship the host of heaven on the housetops: Those who worship and swear *oaths* by the LORD. But who *also* swear by Milcom: ⁶ Those who have turned back from following the LORD, And have not sought the LORD, nor inquired of Him." ⁷ Be silent in the presence of the Lord GOD; For the day of the LORD is at hand, For the LORD has prepared a sacrifice; He has invited His guests. ⁸ "And it shall be, In the day of the LORD's sacrifice. That I will punish the princes and the king's children. And all such as are clothed with foreign apparel. ⁹ In the same day I will punish All those who leap over the threshold, Who fill their masters' houses with violence and deceit. ¹⁰ "And there shall be on that day," says the LORD,

"The sound of a mournful cry from the Fish Gate, A wailing from the Second Quarter, And a loud crashing from the hills.

- 1:1 635-625 B.C. Contemporary of Jeremiah. In 622 Book of the Law found and sweeping returns made by Josiah.
- 1:4 Baal is the Canaanite god of fertility. People would both worship Baal and the Lord. This <u>mix</u> of worship caused judgment to come upon the Land.
- 1:5 Housetops would have clear view of the sky. 628 B.C. Josiah tore down all altars to Baal, burned the bones of false prophets and broke the carved idols.

Worship of the host of heaven— the stars, sun and moon. Astrology prominent in this worship, which was strictly forbidden by God. These false gods had worship by humans, which involved child sacrifice, astrology and sacred prostitution (especially Molech worship).
